3 Scout Group

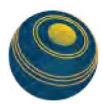

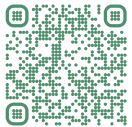

Interesting Fact

The coastal strip between Campbells Bay (south of Mairangi Bay) and Murrays Bay (to the north) was named by Maori 'Waipapa Bay'. Translated this means water over wood. The name referred to quantities of logs and timber thought to be the remains of a fossilised forest that were revealed at low tide.

What does Mairangi mean? There are a few versions of translations including 'from the heavens', 'song from heaven', 'hidden (or sheltered) arm' and 'maire tree'. It is thought the residents ultimately chose the name as they understood it to mean 'welcome sun'.
